
The Oracle Project

...or how to run a sustainable cultural cooperation project

A training game for cultural students and professionals. Its goal is to improve the skills to implement international cultural cooperation and intercultural projects. The game can also be an integration tool for starting ...

Pedagogical Goals of the Game:

- To understand the specifics of cooperation in partnership projects
- To know what is the value of the international cultural cooperation projects
- To communicate precisely with project partners, considering the needs of both the consortium and those specific to its organization

- To know the importance of efficient management of uncertainty and risk
- To know the risks associated with non-enough professional project implementation
- To make choices at the intersection of project goals, limited resources, and quality of services provided

Game Setup:

Goal of the Game: Your main team's goal is to manage the project effectively throughout its lifecycle. Team Formation: We play in teams of 5 players. If your group has not enough players for another

independent team, two players can combine into a single character.

Multiple Teams: Each team plays independently, in parallel with others. No inter-team competition takes place. At the end, we will share results and compare different dynamics.

Character Roles: Each player assumes a character representing both a specific 'persona' and 'organisation', as described in the Character Sheet.

Confidentiality of Goals: Keep your individual goals confidential. Do not share them with other players. Team Cooperation: Each player has limited resources (time & money) to be collectively invested in the decisions taken together. Everyone should play considering both common and the individual goals and available resources.

Objective & Structure:

Game Duration: The game consists of some rounds and other unexpected situations, each representing a decision-making phase in project management. There are 14 decisions to be made.

Steps in Each Round:

- 1. Understand the Challenge: Familiarize yourselves with the project management challenge at hand.
- 2. Team Decision: As a team, choose the decision you believe is most optimal (you have a set timeframe for each quest to decide).
- 3. Resource Allocation: Allocate the necessary resources (money tokens and working time tokens) based on your decision.
- 4. Submit the Decision: Communicate your choice to the Game Master.

Remember: The goal of a cooperative project is not to win individually but to cooperate with each other to achieve the mission of the project

The Oracle Project:

The Oracle Project is a 24-month initiative uniting 5 diverse cultural organizations - from an industrial area festival fair to a prestigious rural festival, spanning different cities and contexts.

The consortium collaborates to stimulate international cultural development and exchange through:

- A Co-production Design Workshop
- Selection of 3 joint co-productions
- Artist residencies with community engagement activities
- A joint final festival: the Oracle Gala in Mars city.

At its core, the project explores sustainable management of cultural partnerships, challenging organizations to balance artistic excellence with community needs and administrative demands.

The Oracle Project:


Their collaboration culminates in The Oracle Gala, but the journey there requires careful navigation of resource allocation, risk management, and strategic decisions.

Through systematic decision-making and collaborative problem-solving, the project demonstrates how cultural organizations can work together effectively while maintaining their distinct identities and serving their local communities.



Partnership:

Olympia Festival

Hosted in Mars, a large historical city (1 million inhab.), with many cultural venues, vibrant cultural life and international connections. The festival is several days celebrations for the whole city, with dozens of events, international guests, media attention, whole scale promotion. The citizens live with the activities and are massively attending and participating in it.

Golden Age Season

Hosted in Neptune, a small rural town with ancient baths, with burgeose vacation villas, located in the hills of a natural park. A 30 years old small but prestigious festival, with small and dedicate international audience, but without connection with the local residents. They have mixed feeling of satisfaction that so many celebrities are coming, but also frustrated there is a wall between them.

Network of Parnassus Street &

Municipal TheaterNew Dramaurgy Fair Eureka Festival

A network of Periphery Festivals, each with a specific focus, well rooted in its communities. Hosted in Calixto, one of the 6 towns of a Network of municipalities sharing participation in international projects, located on the outskirts of a large metropolis, Jupiter. 3 of them are former industrial towns, and the other 3 are well connected to rural areas.

Located in Mercure, an old industrial periphery of a large metropolis, with social tension and intercultural clashes. Festival-fair, bet by the regional government to regenerate an old industrial area, where international programmers are invited to see the new national productions. It has residence spaces to produce shows and a collaboration program with the local community.

Hosted in Venus, a midsize university city, known by its technological labs and new urban sustainable development. A festival that mixes art with science, at the forefront of new trends, with a hipster audience. It is a must go for dedicated companies, experimental artists, and cutting age cultural institutions. It is not huge in volume but well funded.



Individual Goals:

Each Persona, in addition to working with the rest of the consortium, has their own Individual Goals written on their Character Sheet. This mean balancing between their own goals and the team's goals. Let everyone familiarize themselves with their own goal in order to plan their style of play.

The grant and the project agreement:

Now is the time to present and comment together on the project, its mission, values and the commitment it implies for each partner.

When the proposal was presented to the Sun Federation, the partners committed to contribute a total of 28 work units (8 from the coordinator and 5 each from the other four partners). For its part, the Sun Federation has granted them funding equivalent to 50 budget units to be distributed among members.

#1 To renegotiate the Grant Agreement or not

The deliverables you want to produce will easily exceed the allocated budget and working time availability, but at the same time for you is very important to reach good external evaluation.

Discuss the potential outcomes and determine which strategy you will pursue.

1. Renegotiate the Budget: Reach out to the Sun Federation's project officer to negotiate adjustments to the budget, allowing the project to be implemented within the allocated resources. This approach may be risky, as it could reflect poorly on your professionalism in front of the project officer and external evaluator.

2. Secure Additional Funding: Instead of renegotiating, each partner will seek additional funding to increase the project budget. This would allow you to carry out the original plan as proposed to the Sun Federation, but you cannot be sure if/when you will find additional financing

#2 Distribution of the grant

In the moment before signing the Project Agreement between the partners and the Federation, the latter asks how to distribute the 50 monetary units.

(OR what would be left after deciding on option one or two from the previous quest).

In this meeting, partners must agree on how much is due to each of them based on the volume of responsibility that each assumes.

It is therefore necessary to decide how many units correspond to each partner.

#3 Risk Management Plan

The Consortium needs to decide what steps and actions will be taken to secure various possible aspects of the project implementation. They partially seem to be bureaucracy... But at some point, it might be useful to have them (e.g. Data Protection Rules, Risk Management Plan ...)

Those activities are not directly influencing the events realizations.

You have 2 potential solutions, each with its pros and cons. Discuss the possible outcomes and choose the strategy you will pursue.

#4 Kick Off Communication

The Consortium needs to decide on the approach towards communication and dissemination. Some elements were put during the application, but it was written in a hurry, so we have to decide on final approach.

1. Build From Scratch: We will create all the communication channels and content from the ground up: project website, project's digital presence ourselves, and budget to maintain control over the entire process.

#5 The Co-production Design Workshop



We know what we want, but soon the content must be delivered. We planned to meet at partners premises. It requires travelling abroad (time and money) but we think it will fasten works and also support integration between partners.

There was an idea to put format to hybrid, so some savings could be introduced (money and time of course!), but questions on the efficiency arouse.

We must decide between:

1. On-Site Collaboration: We'll invest four days meeting in person. This allows us to ensure that all parties involved have a clear vision of the project's common output. Plus, we'll enjoy local cuisine and strengthen our working relationships.

2. Hybrid Collaboration: Partners are busy, and traveling would disrupt other processes. While some have unreliable internet connections and time zone differences, we'll save time and money by working virtually.

#6 Call for Artistic Proposals

As the project progresses, it's time to invite artists to join. But with whom we want to work? We put into the application basic requirements, but it was unclear if we fully opening the call for artists or if we have a possibility to nominate the artists that would fit into expectations.

1. Open Call: We will announce an open, non-discriminatory call for artists, seeking diverse and inspiring portfolios. This approach supports innovation and diversity but can sometimes lead to frustration, as some artists may not be as reliable as hoped. However, it provides a platform for emerging talent.

Each partner has potential candidates, but we need to choose three. This route could bring us well-known artists with large followings, but it also narrows our scope.



#8 The Residence: Community Work

Finally, our artists started their residency programme. They are excited and so are hosts. Important part of the project activity are community works performed by artists. Such an approach will contribute to keeping local aspects into the grand performance prepared by the residents.

At the same time on human level real interactions are inspiring for both sides. There are few factors to be taken into account: language difference, organizational aspects, strong personalities of artists and potential challenge on reaching to local community and including all key audience group into workshops.


